
**Health:** To create an environment where residents, families, and communities can access the support they need to maintain or improve their health and well-being

**Education:** To improve student outcomes and engage families in the education of their children so children have the opportunity for educational attainment and life success

**Financial Stability:** To connect individuals to opportunities that provide a pathway for economic mobility, ultimately breaking the cycle of poverty

**Basic Needs:** To provide direct assistance to those in urgent need of basic necessities such as food, clothing, transportation, toiletries, shelter, safety, etc.

#### Overview



Since 1995, United Way has supported:

839 community building projects by433 local all-volunteer based groups for over\$877,814.

In 2022, United Way funded 14 Mini-Grant projects for a total of \$27,500.

### Eligibility

#### Who Can Apply

- New or existing <u>all-volunteer</u> groups located in Greater New Bedford
- Groups are defined as having at least 3 members unified by a common cause
- Annual budget/income of group must not exceed \$40,000
- Be based in New Bedford, Acushnet, Dartmouth, Fairhaven, Freetown, Mattapoisett, Marion, Rochester, or Wareham
- Have an all-inclusive membership and mission, i.e., does not exclude people on the basis of gender, race, religious differences, etc
- Legal incorporation 501(c)(3) not required

#### Who Cannot Apply

- Fraternal organizations, political campaigns or religious activities
- Groups which discriminate
- Any previous recipient that did not adhere to the terms, conditions, and commitments of the Mini-Grants Program





### How we define a group

- An established group made up of 3 or more people
- A newly formed group made up of 3 or more people
- Groups can be made up of children and youth, but must have at least 1 adult member
- Can be a "Friends of" group as long as the group can make the case for the need and the distinction is clear
- Groups should not be a committee or task force of a larger coalition, initiative, collaboration, or project at another non-profit organization or business





## What are we looking for?

#### **Projects should...**

- Provide creative solutions to issues that are engaging, community driven, and foster unity through action
- Raise awareness for a specific area of concern
- Be small in scale, but have the potential for long-term impact
- Be specific, innovative and achievable within 1 year
- Engage citizens to address a need or issue of concern aligned with a United Way focus area
- BUILD COMMUNITY!



#### What we will not fund

- Salaries or stipends for group members
- Rent or utilities
- Food for sale or nonessential to the project
- T-shirts and other promotional items for sale
- Office equipment- computers, printers, laptops, etc.
- Paid advertising
- Insurance, Security, Police/Fire Detail

- Application/Registration/Membership Dues/Fees
- Scholarships, Pageants, Contests etc.
- School-based field trips
- Projects that are in and of themselves fundraising
- Capital Improvements


## **Funding Specifics**

- Projects <u>may be</u> funded up to \$2,500
- All funds are disbursed on a reimbursement only basis
- Reimbursements requests <u>must</u> be made on online via CommunityForce
- One project per group per funding cycle


