A FRESH LOOK

You may have noticed a fresh new look at United Way of Greater New Bedford (UWGNB). In October 2024, we proudly launched the updated United Way brand, designed to ensure the relevance and sustainability of one of the world's largest and most trusted charities for the next century of impact.

This renewed brand reflects a promise to continue mobilizing communities into action so that everyone can thrive, with a clear focus on four key areas: healthy community, youth opportunity, financial security, and community resiliency.

At the heart of the brand refresh is a revitalized visual identity. United Way's iconic "circle of hope" logo has been unboxed, symbolizing the dynamic,

carried the brand throughout our other locations, including the Family Resource Center, creating seamless continuity across all our spaces.

Thanks to the generosity of the Manton Foundation, we introduced a new Hunger Commission truck, enabling us to rescue and deliver food to our partners more efficiently than ever before.

As you explore this year's annual report, you will see our brighter color palette and our bold statement: United is the Way. More importantly, you will see that while our look has evolved, our commitment to Greater New Bedford remains steadfast and stronger than ever.

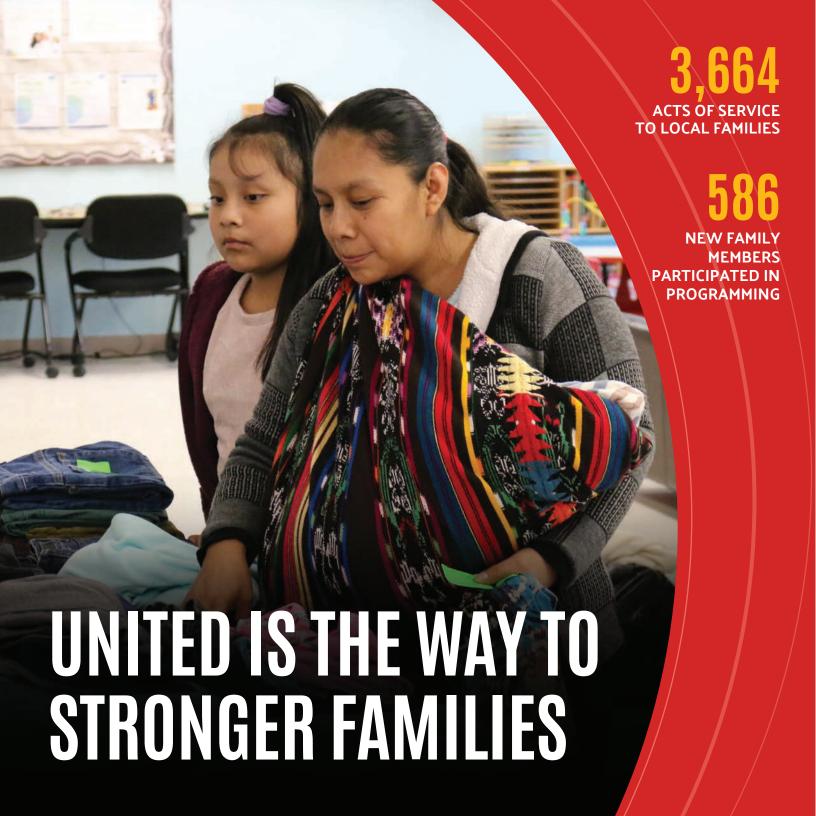




One of the most visible and impactful ways United Way of Greater New Bedford serves the community is through the Hunger Commission. Since 1995, this food rescue and delivery program has been a lifeline for food-insecure residents. Operating five days a week with a full-time coordinator, the Hunger Commission distributes rescued food to more than 30 local pantries, shelters, soup kitchens, and Council on Aging centers.

Partnerships are central to this work. Collaborations with Sharing the Harvest Community Farm, a program of YMCA Dartmouth, and Coastal Foodshed provide a steady supply of fresh produce, while new partnerships with local fishermen allow us to distribute bycatch, a valuable source of protein. We are also expanding vendor relationships to diversify the food available to the programs we serve.

Beyond distribution, our engagement with the Southcoast Food Policy Council and other United Ways across Massachusetts connects us to advocacy, innovation, and collaboration—strengthening our ability to address food insecurity locally and statewide.

The **New Bedford Family Resource Center** (FRC) is part of a network of 33 centers throughout the State offering support and training to families with children 18 and younger. The FRC promotes self-sufficiency, strengthens family bonds, and enhances children's connections to their community.

FRC offers a safe place for caregivers to meet with a Family Support Worker to access programs, training, and community resources. Families often arrive with a challenge they need to address such as a housing issue or food insecurity and end up participating in all types of programs and services offered at FRC such as a 12-week Parenting Journey class, toys for the holidays, resume building workshops, and much more. In all its work, the FRC's goal is for families to stabilize and succeed.



United Way serves as the fiscal partner for the New Bedford Community Connections Coalition (NBCCC). Guided by an advisory board representing community members and key institutions in New Bedford, NBCCC is dedicated to preventing child abuse and neglect, strengthening families, and building healthier communities. NBCCC works collaboratively with local partners to improve the lives of children and families throughout New Bedford. This year, NBCCC supported foster families, helped families cope with the effects of substance abuse, and raised awareness of the



NBCCC supports the "Patch" model, a neighborhood-based approach to child welfare and family support services in partnership with the Department of Children and Families area office. Patch focuses on two targeted areas within the City of New Bedford. By working closely with families in their own communities, Patch helps deliver more effective, accessible, and relationship-driven support.

HOLIDAY HAPPENINGS

The holiday season is a special time at United Way of Greater New Bedford, when we join with community partners to help families keep the magic of the holidays alive. For more than a decade, we've teamed up with Fun 107 and WBSM through **Holiday Wishes**, supporting families facing hardships such as job loss, illness, or unexpected crises. Last year, six families received life-changing assistance through the program.

To reach even more children, we also partner with the **New Bedford Fire Department** to collect thousands of toys each holiday season. While toys for younger kids are plentiful, gifts for teens are harder to come by. Thanks to a grant from Senator Mark Montigny's Children's Fund, we were able to provide gift cards so their holidays were just as bright.

Local businesses also step up by adopting families, hosting giving trees, and donating toys and gifts, which are distributed through our Family Resource Center. This past year, 34 families received not only toys but also essential household items, helping them start the new year with stability and hope.

We are deeply grateful to our partners and community members who make the holidays shine brighter for local families.

Financial security is a pivotal component of an individual's overall well-being. Our financial wellness initiatives provide practical support for employees, women, and the broader community, helping individuals gain confidence and control over their personal finances.

The **Financial Wellness at Work** program embeds trained United Way coordinators in the workplace to provide confidential one-on-one coaching, quarterly workshops, and access to resources including small dollar loans from TFed Credit Union. The program empowers employees to make informed financial decisions. Now operating at six companies, our onsite coordinators are skilled coaches who can make referrals and leverage established relationships with community service providers. This program is a valuable resource for employers as they work to build a strong, resilient workforce.

Financial Wellness for Women, powered by Women United, is a new curriculum developed this year with local banking and financial partners. This 10-week program provides comprehensive financial literacy education, pared with support from volunteer coaches. This year, we graduated 25 women who received individualized guidance, equipping them with the tools and confidence to make informed decisions.

This has been a year of financial wellness growth and collaboration, and we are excited to see the positive impact these programs will have on our community.

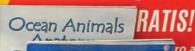

Women United powers innovative programs that ensure families have the opportunity to keep their kids learning and growing from a young age.

Wash & Read commits to literacy and family connection by bringing books directly to places families already go. Partner laundromats feature welcoming reading corners where children can enjoy books – turning laundry time into a chance for learning, bonding, and discovery. Children are also welcome to take home books to build up their home libraries. This year we expanded efforts and added 2 new laundromat reading corners.

Lantern, formerly known as Bright by Text, is a free text messaging platform that delivers trusted resources to parents and caregivers from pregnancy through the preteen years. With tips, activities, community programs, and information designed to strengthen families and foster healthy development, Lantern helps caregivers feel supported in every stage of their child's growth.



BRIGHT BEGINNINGS

Welcoming a new baby should be a joyful time, but it can also feel overwhelming -especially for families already facing financial challenges. That's why Women United Leaders, with the support of local businesses, assembled **Baby Bundles**, providing parents with much-needed essentials like diapers and wipes and helpful information on local resources like early intervention and parent groups so they can feel supported right from the start.

This past year, we launched a **Community Baby Shower**. This special day was designed to bring the excitement of a traditional baby shower to families who may not otherwise have that experience, and to distribute Baby Bundles. It's more than just receiving baby items; it's about celebrating together. It gives parents a chance to meet other parents and learn more about resources that can support them on their new journey. We collaborated with over 20 community partners to provide information on local services.

When families feel supported and celebrated, they're stronger, helping to build a stronger community for us all.

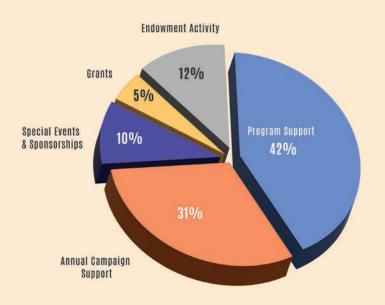

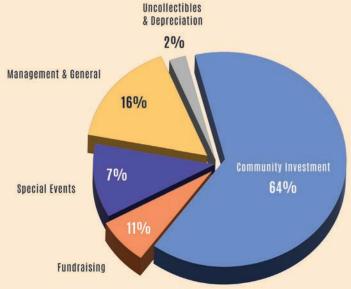

MAKING A DIFFERENCE

We believe stronger communities are built when people come together to take action. That's why volunteerism is at the heart of what we do-creating opportunities for individuals, families, and businesses to make a tangible impact.

Days of Caring, a United Way tradition, connects volunteers with local nonprofits to complete projects they couldn't do alone. From our Youth Day of Caring each spring to our signature event with local businesses, these days showcase the power of collective action.

Hunger Heroes brings families together to fight hunger. From packing kids' meals during spring break to assembling Thanksgiving dinners, it's become a cherished community tradition. Since 2015, volunteers have packaged 9,000 meals, engaged 2,078 people, and collected over 151,000 lbs of food.

Through **Mobile Markets**, volunteers distribute fresh, local produce from Sharing the Harvest Community Farm, a program of YMCA Southcoast Dartmouth to families in New Bedford and Wareham–tackling food insecurity across the region.

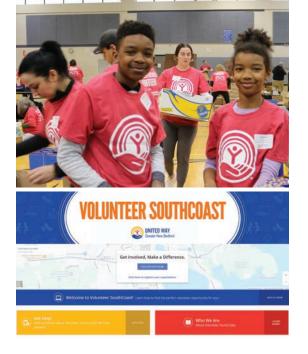
Together, these efforts prove that when we unite, we do more than volunteer—we build stronger, healthier, more resilient communities.
